**Cluster lashes are an alternative to a strip of false lashes. They are applied to the outer corner of the eyes - and give the lashes more thickness and length without looking false. They really accentuate the eye and look spectacular

Do they offer a whole day wedding service? If so, what is their rate?

**you would use this service if you want your make-up artist to be there for touch-ups during the day

Will they do all the make-up themselves or will they employ help on the day? If the do, can you meet the other artist at your trial?

How long will it take per person?

Do they sell make-up for touch-ups for on the day?

How did you feel after the meeting? Did you feel comfortable with the Make-up Artist? Did they seem to know what they were talking about? Did they make you feel confident in their abilities? How did they present themselves?

Other questions / concerns

TIPS

Make sure your make-up artist is able to travel to you as you don't want to be having to go from here, there and everywhere on your wedding day. It is your day and you should be relaxing as much as possible, plus it's nice to feel pampered.

We also recommend you buy the lipstick you will be using on the day, plus a mineral foundation powder for touch ups.

DO NOT use any face mists or sprays on your face after your make-up has been applied. This will cause the make-up to go blotchy. You can get a Make-up Setting Spray that can be used by your make-up artist after your make-up has been applied. Also Napoleon and MAC have "Blotting Pads" that you can use to stop sweat beads on your face, ask your artist if they have these available.

If you don't already about 3 months before your wedding make sure you have started a face cleansing routine, including exfoliating weekly. Doing this will help your make-up sit better on your skin. Exfoliate your face the morning of your wedding, again this will help how your make-up sits on the day.

Before you book or pay any money make sure you have a trial so:

- you can see how the make-up sits on your face
- you can see how long it will last
- if there are any adjustments you would like made better you find out at your trial than on your wedding day

Have your trial in the morning so you can see how the make-up wears through the day and into the night. Generally a good night to have a trial is for your Hens Night.
